Updated Guidance - A Summary

You have been bombarded with Health & Safety advice recently, which is also constantly changing. Please see the summary below which contains the latest guidance and hopefully answers questions from parents that have arisen over the past couple of days.

- If a person has symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), however mild, medical advice is to immediately self-isolate at home for at least 10 days from when symptoms started.

- Anyone in the school community with symptoms of Covid would be sent home immediately and asked to have a test. Their classroom would be deep cleaned and other children removed.
- If the test was positive, they should follow the Coronavirus (COVID-19): Stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19)
<https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance/stay-at-home-guidance-for-households-with-possible-coronavirus-covid-19-infection>. Additionally, any person whose household member tests positive for Covid-19 must also isolate for 14 days.
- If there is a case in school, parents of the class bubble would be informed immediately and everyone in that bubble would have to isolate for 14 days. The other household members of that wider class or group would not need to self-isolate unless the child, young person or staff member they live with in that group subsequently develops symptoms
- The school community (ie all parents) would be informed.
- In the event of any confirmed cases, school would be in close contact with the Local Authority for advice and support. - As part of the national test and trace programme, if other cases are detected within the cohort or in the wider setting, Public Health England's local health protection teams will conduct a rapid investigation and will advise schools and other settings on the most appropriate action to take. In some cases a larger number of other children, young people may be asked to self-isolate at home as a precautionary measure - perhaps the whole class, site or year group.
- Where settings are observing guidance on infection prevention and control, which will reduce risk of transmission, closure of the whole setting will not generally be necessary.
