The Romans	<p>Make your own Roman shield using a piece of cardboard and papier-mâché for hole that protects your hand. Then decorate it in true Roman fashion!</p> <p>Research more about the Romans and Hadrian's Wall.</p>
SPAG	<p>Learn about Fronted Adverbial Phrases (FAP), extended noun phrases and putting apostrophes in the correct places for contractions and possessions.</p> <p>Practice writing sentences using <u>would have</u> (correct way) instead of <u>would of</u> (wrong way).</p>
English	<p>Read every day and write it in your reading diary.</p> <p>Write a letter home, as though you were a Roman soldier living and working in Britain. Remember to ask your family for those woolly socks as Britain gets very cold!!</p> <p>Learn 108 spellings and/or other spelling sheet given.</p>
